Rajdhani College is a constituent college of the University of Delhi. It was established in 1964 by the Delhi Administration in Kirti Nagar, New Delhi under the name of Government College. The college acquired its new name when the Delhi administration vested its governance in an autonomous Governing Body.

The College is situated in West Delhi on Mahatma Gandhi Marg (Ring Road) near Raja Garden, New Delhi. Its beautiful and spacious building was constructed in 1976-77. The college is accessible from all corners of Delhi. Ramesh Nagar and Rajouri Garden Metro Stations are just a few steps away from the college. The college complex has an air-conditioned Seminar/Conference Room, an air-conditioned Auditorium, a well-stocked Library with Computer & Internet facility, and well-equipped Science Laboratories, as well as Computer Laboratories. ENGLISH LITERARY ASSOCIATION

With the beginning of the Academic session 2014-15, English Literary Association (ELA) paced its literary journey by celebrating the 450th birth anniversary of 'William Shakespeare' in collaboration with FORTELL on 23rd September, 2014. The literary event was graced by the presence of chief guest Prof. Shormistha Panja, Joint Director, Institute of Lifelong Learning, University of Delhi who presented her paper titled "Visual Shakespeare" on the occasion. Her paper examined how the paintings and illustrations of Shakespeare's plays and retellings depicted the culture in which they were created. Taking the example of two Bengali prose retellings of Shakespeare, she argued how illustrations of the plays depicted the emerging, rebellious Bengal. She also argued that the 'visual Shakespeare'/illustrations of these retellings often has an independent narrative of their own which is detached from the verbal text of the plays and hence adds one more dimension of Shakespeare to be debated upon. The event was also marked by the presence of special invitee Dilip Kumar Basu, Associate Professor (retired) of Rajdhani College. On the occasion, the students presented an act titled 'Universal Shakespeare'. The act was an experiment with modern theatre - a combination of 'Shadow work' and 'Mime'. The 'Shadow work' formed the background which comprised the prominent scenes from some of the famous plays of Shakespeare while 'Mime' was an act which covered major emotions of Shakespeare's plays. The combined act formed a collage which presented Shakespeare in an entirely new, avant-garde form.

The Association also organised its annual festival 'Lit- Spirit' on 27 March 2015. As part of the festival, various inter-college competitions were organised providing students an opportunity to showcase their literary, creative and dramatic talents. 'Verse and

Tale' made students use their imagination and experiences to compose inspiring and beautiful stories and poems. In 'Quiz Bowl' participants, displayed their knowledge of the world of literature. 'Drama-Expresso' was a true delight for the audience as this segment of the fest had some brilliant and humourous impromptu performances by the participants. The competitions were followed by the screening of a documentary 'Bard in Bharat' to celebrate the influence of the eminent English playwright and poet, William Shakespeare on Indian art forms. The fest concluded with a spectacular enactment of T.S. Eliot's poem 'Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock' by the students of the department.

INDO-JAPAN CONFERENCE

Rajdhani College took the initiative in promoting research activities of our college to an international level. Rajdhani College in collaboration with University of Tokyo, Japan. organized an international conference on “Remote sensing of Earth's Atmosphere” which was held in University of Delhi on 5 September 2014. International conference was organized keeping in view the knowledge level of undergraduates students. The talks were presented by Professors, Scientists and research scholars from Japan as well as all over India. The talks were based on climate changes which generated curiosity and interest among students to pursue research in this area. They also got an idea about how to apply for different research activities in India as well as foreign countries.

As a step forward in this direction a MoU has also been signed between Rajdhani college and University of Tokyo, Japan. Besides Tokyo University, other universities and institutes are also collaborating in this MoU viz. Nagoya University, Women's Nara University, NIES (National Institute of Environmental studies). Under this MoU, our faculty will be able to visit University of Tokyo, Japan and vice-versa. This MoU will also help students and faculty of both the nation to exchange their ideas, research work and culture to a great extent.

As a further extension of research activities being planned under this MoU, an instrument is also installed at badouli, Sonapat (Haryana) which would provide information about the emission levels of methane gas in rice paddy fields of India. This data would help in enhancing our understanding about the role of methane as a contributing factor towards global warming. The success of International conference and signing of MoU was possible only due to the great insight and vision of Dr. S.K. Innovation Projects – 2015

Study of Atmospheric Gas Pollution and UV Radiation

Innovating factor for the present project is the strong connectedness between the environment, health and technology issues. As is well known, pollution causes a number of health hazards. With the depletion of Ozone layer and increase in pollution along with high UV index, life is being threatened. Hence a sensor which can detect the pollution levels and hence warn us of possible problems is the need of the day.

Two light weight nanorods based sensor have been designed using interdisciplinary approach. The AC RD-202 sensor may be used wherever mains power supply is available and DC RD-202 can be used as a handheld sensor for installation in open areas like ground sewer areas and for sensing applications requiring continuous movement. The sensor is based on ZnO nanorods and has good sensitivity for UV radiations and gases. The nanorods provide a very high sensitivity due to large surface area/volume. Wide band gap ($\sim 3.4\text{eV}$) and large binding energy ($\sim 60\text{ meV}$) of ZnO makes it suitable for UV sensing and room temperature luminescent properties.

A very great achievement for our designed sensor is that it works at ro and can be used to sense toxic gases (2-2000ppm lev) and it has a fast response time Our sensor requires no warm up time as needed in some commercially available sensors (Detector Electronics Corporation, U.S.A. Nanotechnology MOX for H 2S.). The complete sensor has been developed in our college lab starting

from the initial stage of hydrothermal growth of nanorods upto the final stage of circuit designing. Only the characterization has been carried out at labs outside our college.
